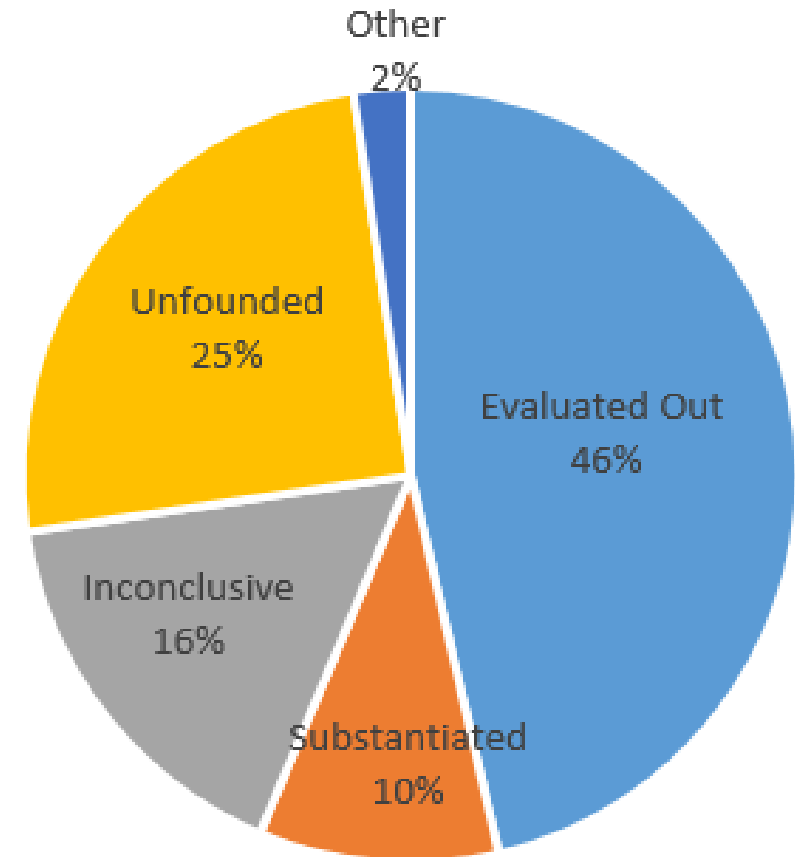

# 2016 STATISTICS – SUBSTANTIATED REFERRALS

In 2016:

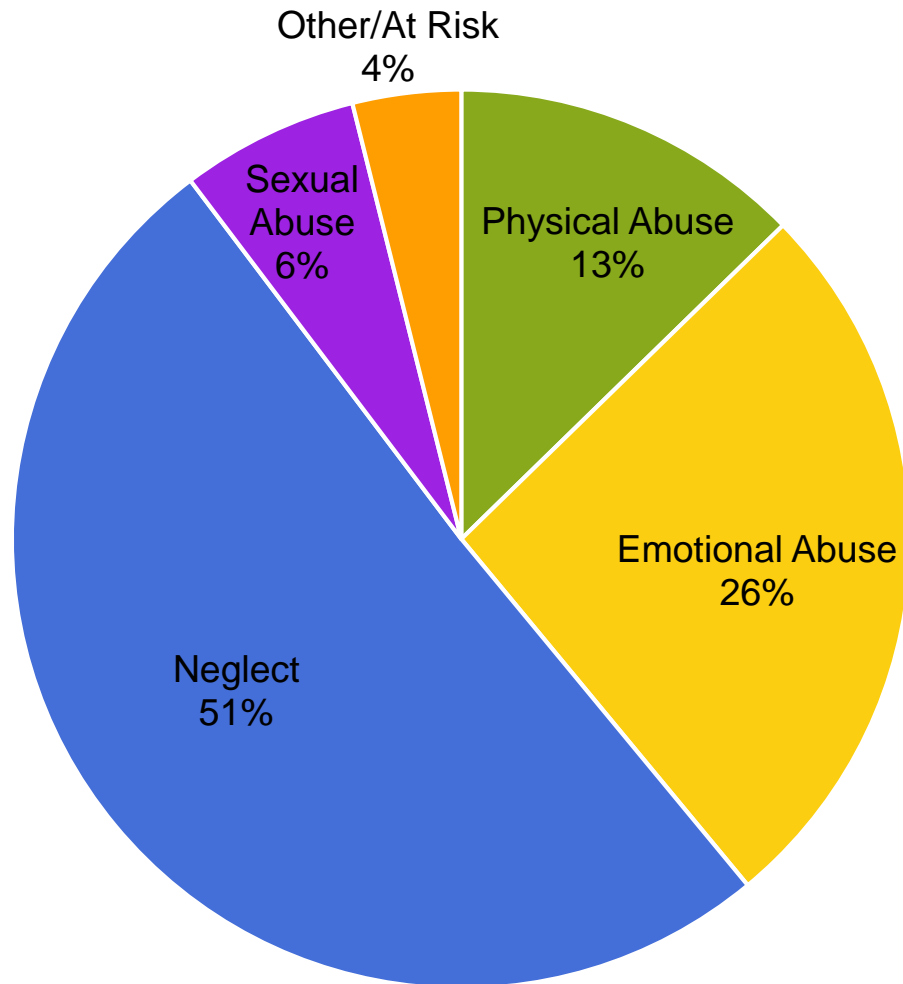
- 3,290 total referrals were received by Children’s Services.
- Of these:
  - 1,525 did not meet the criteria for child welfare involvement
  - 1,358 were determined to be unfounded or inconclusive
  - 329 were substantiated for child abuse

# IMPACT OF ACES IN CHILD WELFARE

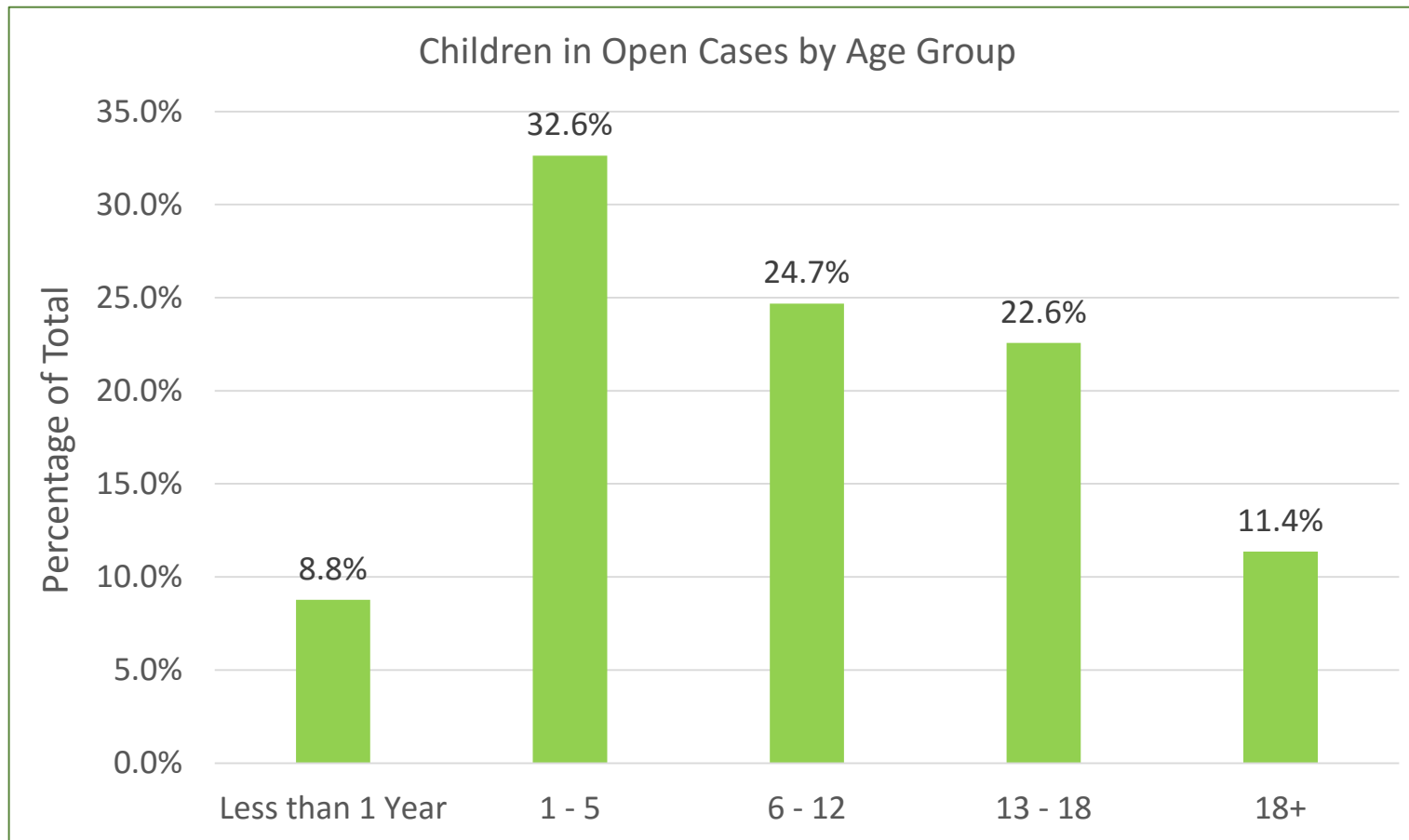
## Referrals by Type of Allegation



- With an ACE score of 4, an individual is:
  - 5 times more likely to suffer from depression
  - 7 times more likely to consider themselves an alcoholic
  - 10 times more likely to use illicit drugs
  - 12 times more likely to attempt suicide

# CURRENT PLACEMENTS - AGE BREAKDOWN

- As of March 27, 2017, Shasta County had a total of 616 youth in open cases
